I am writing to confirm that our investigation into the accuracy of the data relating to LSAT scores and GPAs that we submitted last fall for Villanova University School of Law's 2010 entering class confirmed that our submitted figures were accurate. 

As I mentioned in our conversation, we have had these numbers verified as part of an independent investigation conducted by Ropes and Gray. Because our investigation is still ongoing, we are not able at this time to provide information concerning the scope of the inaccurate admissions data for earlier years. It is our hope that the matter will be concluded shortly.

I want to assure you that we take this matter seriously. The Law School's admissions organizational structure is being reconfigured. We are also working to bring in a nationally recognized firm to help review our data collection and reporting procedures and to make recommendations concerning policies and procedures that will ensure accurate and complete collection and reporting of data. In short, we are strengthening the Law School's systems of checks and balances to assure that this situation does not recur. We are committed to having a reporting system that is above reproach.
